With the arrival of spring, we often experience a variety of weather conditions, from sudden rain showers to severe storms. It is crucial for us to be prepared and proactive in safeguarding ourselves, our loved ones, and our workplaces against these weather-related hazards.

As safety professionals, it is important that we advance awareness and preparedness to ensure the highest level of safety & health. Here are some essential tips and preparations to keep in mind:

- Stay Informed: Monitor weather forecasts regularly to stay updated on any impending storms or severe weather alerts in your area. If you work outdoors be aware of lightning and wind as both require planning and quick decisions to protect people
- Develop a Plan: Create a comprehensive emergency plan for your home and workplace, including evacuation routes, emergency contacts, and essential supplies.
- Secure Outdoor Items: At home secure or store outdoor furniture, equipment, and other loose items that could become projectiles during high winds. At work, be mindful of items that have large surface area such as tarps, plywood, etc.
- Maintain Emergency Kits: Ensure that your emergency kits are stocked with essential items such as non-perishable food, water, flashlights, batteries, and first aid supplies.
- Review Safety Procedures: Review safety procedures with your family, colleagues, and employees, emphasizing the importance of seeking shelter and staying indoors during severe weather events.
